

Cookie policy

Website www.web3eurosummit.eu respects privacy and strives to ensure the security of any data we collect from visitors to our website.

The cookie policy describes the types of cookies that we may use on our website and the purpose of using them.

1. What are cookies

Cookie file is a file consisting of letters and numbers that can be stored in your browser or on your device's hard drive.

First-party and third-party cookies:

- First-party cookies are those cookies that we place on our website.
- Third-party cookies are cookies that are set not by us, but by a third party, on our website.

Persistent cookies: these cookies remain on the user's device for a certain period specified in the cookie file. They are activated every time a user visits this website.

Session cookies: these cookies allow you to identify and link user actions during a browser session. A browser session starts when the user opens a browser window and ends when the browser window is closed. Session cookies are created temporarily. After closing the browser, all session cookies are deleted.

2. What cookies can be used on our website and for what purpose?

The cookies that we may use on the website can be classified as follows::

- Strictly necessary
- Productive

Some cookies may perform several of these functions simultaneously.

Strictly necessary cookies allow you to navigate the website and use important features related to security, among other things. Without these cookies, it is not possible to ensure the proper functioning of the website.

Strictly necessary cookies can be used for example:

- For security reasons.

If you prohibit the functioning of these cookies, the proper operation of the website during your visit may be at risk.

Productive cookies collect information about how you use the website, such as what pages you visit and whether you encounter errors. These cookies do not collect any information that can identify you and are only used to help improve the site's performance.

Productive cookies can be used, for example, for:

- Track any errors that occur.

3. List of cookies on the site

Technical name	Purpose	Session/Persistent	Type
_ga	Registers a unique ID that is used to generate statistical data on how the visitor uses the website.	Persistent	HTTP
ga#	Used by Google Analytics to collect data on the number of times a user has visited the website as well as dates for the first and most recent visit.	Persistent	HTTP

4. When do we need your consent

All cookies require your consent.

We ask for your consent before placing them on your device. You can give your consent by clicking the appropriate button on the displayed banner. If you do not want to give consent or want to withdraw your consent to any cookies at any time, you will need to delete and block or disable cookies using your browser settings. Please note that disabling these cookies will affect the functionality of the website and may prevent you from accessing certain features.

5. How to delete or block cookies

Most web browsers allow some control over most cookies through browser settings. However, if you use your web browser settings to block all cookies (including strictly required cookies), you may not be able to access the entire website or parts of it. If you have not configured your browser settings so that it refuses cookies, our system will create cookies immediately after visiting the website.

Change the cookie settings. Browser settings for changing cookie settings are usually found in the “Settings” menu of your internet browser. To understand these settings, the following links may be useful. Otherwise, you should use the “Help” option in your internet browser for more information.
